
## A Continuum Model for Understanding Youth Participation

This continuum can help you understand and identify how power is shared among youth and adults within your organization. Different organizations may have different values and goals for youth participation, and the power balance will probably shift in one direction or another, or even back and forth, over time. Regardless of where your group or organization falls on the continuum, it is important to understand your organization's level of youth participation and to identify your own goals for youth involvement.



- None: Adults have complete authority over the project.
- Manipulation: Adults use youth involvement to communicate their own messages.
- **Decoration**: Adults use youth to promote or support a cause without informing youth. Youth are not involved in design or decisions.
- **Tokenism**: Symbolic representation by few youth. Adults set the agenda and make decisions. Youth may not have genuine voice and may be asked to speak for the group they represent.
- **Assigned & Informed**: Youth do not initiate the project, but understand it and have some sense of ownership.
- **Consulted & Informed**: Project is designed and run by adults who consult with youth. Youth make recommendations that are considered by adults.
- Adult Initiated, Shared Decisions with Youth: Project is designed and run by adults who share decisions with youth.
- Youth & Adult Initiated & Directed: Project is designed and run by youth and adults in full partnership.
- Youth Initiated, Shared Decisions with Adults: Project is designed and run by youth who share decisions with adults.
- Youth Initiated & Directed: Project is designed and run by youth and decisions are made by youth.
